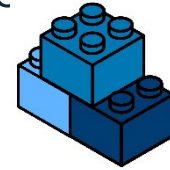
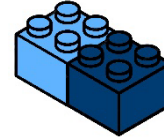
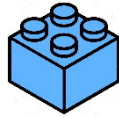


Three Implementation Models | Layering effectiveness



Implementation Strategy	Tier 1: Clinic Posters & Baskets of Locks	Tier 2: Universal Firearm Safe Storage Counseling + Tier 1	Tier 3: EHR Prompt + Tiers 1 & 2
<i>Description</i>	Display posters and baskets of locks in pediatric provider exam rooms	Universal brief firearm safe storage counselling by pediatric providers and locks managed in exam or waiting rooms.	EHR-based prompt for firearm safe storage counseling with offer of a cable lock during pediatric well-visits
<i>Effectiveness</i>	Low (patient self-directed, low reach, untested)	Medium (clinician led, exam room locks better visual reminder)	High (empirically tested best practice)
<i>Implementation Considerations</i>	• Locks managed by admin staff • Full team training (5-10 min) with talking points during regular meeting/huddle. • Clinic lead identified • Depending on lock basket location other departments may need brief training too.	• Locks managed by admin staff. • Full team training (5-10 min) • Clinician training (30 min) • Baskets of locks in exam and/or waiting rooms. • Clinic lead identified • Practice facilitation support.	• Locks managed by admin staff. • Full team training (5-10 min) • Clinician training (30 min) • Baskets of locks in exam room. • Clinic lead identified • Practice facilitation support • HealthConnect prompt
